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- **APA Style Refresher:** Join a discussion to refresh or update your knowledge of APA rules for citation. Some quick tips for formatting will also be discussed.
- **Getting to the Core of Business Case Studies:** How do you grapple with real-world business situations, analyze unique circumstances, and even take action? Case studies provide us with the nature and scope of authentic business issues. Learn the core components of case studies and how to leverage them in your academic and professional work.
- **Preparing to Submit for Possible Publication:** Join us for an information session that will help provide you with strategies for drafting and tackling the process of transforming a course/seminar paper into an article manuscript.
- **Thesis & Dissertation Format Review:** ASU's Graduate College format review team will present information and resources to help students format theses and dissertations according to ASU's Graduate College guidelines. Students will also learn tips for avoiding common formatting mistakes.
- **Starting the Thesis & Dissertation Writing Process:** Learn tips for planning time to research and write for your thesis or dissertation project. Presenters will also discuss strategies for staying organized while writing the thesis or dissertation.
- **Strategies for Producing Academic Arguments:** Students will build upon the concepts presented in "Understanding Academic Arguments" and discuss strategies for writing academic arguments related to any of their individual research questions or writing topics. Attending the previous workshop on arguments is certainly not a requirement to attend this one.
- **Tips for Research Writing:** We all know how to write, but how do we write at the *graduate* level? Attendees will learn key tenets of graduate-level writing: evaluating sources, keeping track of research, argumentation, and more to help take their writing to new heights.
- **Tips for Writing a Literature Review:** Having trouble starting or stopping your literature review process? Presenters will discuss tips on creating a literature review, incorporating it into your paper, and evaluating drafts of your literature review.
- **Understanding Academic Arguments:** Discuss the purpose of arguments by learning how to define and identify some of the most common appeals in academic arguments. Students will also learn strategies for analyzing arguments used by other scholars.
